### GRANT DETAILS

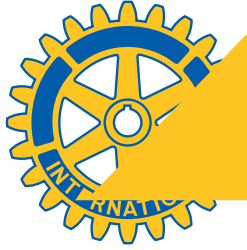

## **WHO ARE WILLIAM JOHN ANDREW & AGNES DOROTHY ANDREW?**

William (Bill) John Andrew was born in 1888 in Ontario, came west to Edmonton in 1913 to work and made his travel to Peace River in 1914. Bill was a skilled blacksmith, an entrepreneur and had a lively personality. Although much of the work done by Bill was shoeing horses, fixing boats and ploughshares, one of his most notable accomplishments include doing all the iron work on the D.A. Thomas, which included the hinge work to allow the smoke-stack to be folded down so the boat could go under the bridge. Bill opened his own blacksmith shop in 1915, farmed some years between and in 1926 he purchased another blacksmith shop and operated it until he retired in 1958. He had a passion for his trade and would sometimes leave more lucrative jobs to take on smaller parts that were more interesting. Bill passed away in 1970.

Agnes Dorothy Andrew was born in 1895 in Ontario, came west to Edmonton in 1904 with her family and moved to Peace River in 1914, again with her family. She married Bill Andrew in 1917 and established a home in Peace River. They had six children whom Agnes devoted her time to the duties of raising. Although Agnes and Bill moved from Peace River in 1967, they never forgot Peace River. After Bill's death, Agnes would return several times to visit families and friends. Agnes passed away in 1980.

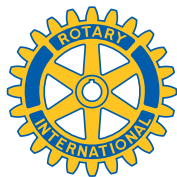
